Dear Friends,

November is the month of Remembrance. This year it's on Sunday 13th when we hold our Remembrance service.

The church calendar this month also includes a Sunday for the Reign of Christ (20th) when we remember that 'Christ is King', and Advent Sunday (27th) when we look forward to Christ's first coming at Christmas, and his second coming yet to be, in power and in glory.

For many children, November may mean different things: there is Hallowe'en which introduces the month, and the night of 5th for fireworks. Both of these have very old religious roots. Thankfully, the controversies and wars which led to the gunpowder plot are long consigned to history. But remembering the saints on 1st November and the fallen on 11th and 13th should never be forgotten.

It's sometimes said that we don't make enough of All Saints Day (November 1^{st}). That may be so. But do we make enough of Advent, and especially the anticipation of the return of Christ? It's the hope of the prayer 'Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven'.

This year, we have seen many tragic events in the world. Many of these things are ongoing stories involving much human suffering. But the Advent hope – our hope as Christians – is that evil will not have the last word, sin will not triumph, suffering will not endure. Rather, Christ is King and he already reigns, and God will put all his enemies under his feet, including the 'last enemy' which is death.

General

The surplus for the quarteris £602 versus a budget deficit of £970. Income

Offerings -Open plate and 'blue envelopes' are slightly less than the budget.

(Note - If you are tax payer and wish the Abbey to recover the tax paid by yourself please would you pick up a gift-aid form from the office or ask Phil for one.)

Miscellaneous -The Abbey has been very fortunate to receive donations to cover the loudspeakers and the audio visual system. These are/will be included in the miscellaneous heading.

Legacies - Two have been received. One from Mrs Moira Main and other from Mrs Nancy Joyce Strachan-Melville. A third large legacy was received in October from Mrs Dorothy Robinson, this will be shown in the fourth quarter accounts.

Expenditure

Premises Costs - The electric and gas bills have been charged based on estimates. Readings will probably be taken in late December. The costs of painting the fence will be included in the fourth quarter accounts.

Office Expenses -These include photocopier repairs, the photocopier is now over five years old and it is proving to be expensive. The running costs of this photocopier are shared with Dirleton Kirk. The future of the photocopier is being reviewed.

Miscellaneous – These include \pounds 2,000 spent on upgrading the sound system in the Sanctuary. The costs of upgrading the audio visual system will be included in the fourth quarter accounts.

To the Minister and congregation of Macfarlane Memorial Church and Pastorate, Kalimpong, Church of North India

Dear Pastor Samuel, Christian brothers & sisters,

It is with great joy that we send our good wishes and the Lord's blessing to you all as you celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the congregation on 1st November 2016.

As your twinned congregations in Scotland, we feel a sense of humility and privilege when we think of the faith and sacrifice of the first Scottish missionaries to the hills of North India, including the Revd. William Macfarlane. He was at a missionary meeting in Glasgow in 1865 when the question was asked 'Who will go?' Macfarlane stood up and replied 'Here am I, send me Lord'. Within 5 years he was in North India.

The world has changed a lot since 1891, but we still need people like him who will respond to the gospel call, and take the good news to places where Christ is not yet named, not only in India but nowadays also in many parts of Scotland!

Your recent 126th Annual Convention had the theme 'Great is Thy Faithfulness'.

We would like to echo the words of that hymn in asking God's richest blessing on all you do in His name:

Pardon for sin and a peace that endureth, Thine own dear presence to cheer and to guide; Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow, Blessings all mine, with ten thousand beside!
