#### KALIMPONG

I have just returned from Kalimpong. It was my fourth visit so I know the leaders of our twinned congregation quite well; despite this they always surprise me.



The purpose of my visit was to be at the service to mark the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Macfarlane Memorial Church. There are two congregations in Kalimpong, now sharing the church building. The Pastorate with whom we are twinned and are part of the Church of North India, and the other a continuing Presbyterian congregation who are part of a break away twenty five years ago. The service on 1 November was a joint service with the two congregations worshipping together for only the second time. The surprise was that the breakaways are the larger congregation.

The service was memorable and I considered it an honour to be present. The Church was full with others standing outside, it was conducted entirely in Nepali, other than my contribution (I had an interpreter). The service was led by the senior minister from the Presbyterian congregation and Pastor Samuel, who preached at Dirleton on their 400<sup>th</sup>Anniversaary, gave the sermon. I was unable to understand much of what was said, over two hours, but the depth of feeling was clear. The reaction to the message from the Moderator of The General Assembly, which I was asked to read out, was surprising. The elders of the Presbyterian side all thanked me for bringing the message. I was also asked to read the message from our minister on behalf of our linked congregations.

The other major event in my program was a visit to Nimbong School. I was most impressed with the progress they have made since they opened less than two years ago. I attended a major assembly and they insisted that I meet with parents and staff.

Each of these events would justify a much more detailed report and I may write one. The present intention is to have an evening meeting on Sunday 4th December at 7.30 to describe them to those who have visited Kalimpong and to others who are interested.
