Dear Friends.

This new year has already seen a lot of big changes in national and international politics: a different relationship with Europe, and changes of leaders overseas. And these are only the ones we know of, who can tell what other surprises 2017 will bring?



Change can bring anxiety and even downright fear. It's often nice to have the comfort of stability, and to feel that things will stay the same for us. But that's seldom the reality of life. I remember once hearing a preacher quote the saying 'constant change is here to stay'. Like many great quotes, we don't know who first said this, but it's no less true for that.

In the church too, change is an ever-present feature. At the moment our presbytery (and the church nationally) is wrestling with issues of how to resource its mission, particularly with decreasing numbers of ministers. This year it's our turn to attend the General Assembly in May, so no doubt I will hear a lot more about that when I'm there. Change may be afoot!

However, in Abbey we're also looking towards positive changes. We're looking forward (as well as upwards of course!). We are blessed with the generosity of our congregation, and we want to use that to expand our mission, our worship, and our activities: 'watch this space'!

The changes we work and pray for are not those of decline or introspection, but ones which put our current Sunday theme into action: Being disciples. And that means following Jesus, which is the biggest change we can ever make in our lives.




