General Assembly, May 2017 - a summary

The Assembly met with Rev Derek Browning as the new Moderator, and HRH Princess Anne the Princess Royal as Her Majesty's Lord High Commissioner.

The **Scottish Bible Society** launched a series of BibleWorld books to be used in schools in place of the mobile exhibition which had been withdrawn after many years.

The **Council of Assembly** issued a Call to Prayer to the whole Church. It also reported on the fall in congregational income, which will continue over future years. Serious financial challenges need to be faced by the Kirk.

The **World Mission Council** gave its report, leaning heavily on the central theme of women in Ministry.

A Joint Report on the **Balfour Declaration** Centenary, to consider how to mark the promise by HM Government to support a Jewish homeland in Palestine, led to lively debate.

The **Social Care Council** reported financial pressures, and changes being made regarding the occupational requirement for all staff to have a Christian faith.

The **Panel on Review & Reform** reminded us that even if we could recruit an extra 200 ministers to plug the current shortage, we would not be able to pay for them.

The **Church and Society Council** reported on the Manchester bombing, reflecting on how our Muslim friends will be feeling and encouraged us to extend the hand of friendship to them. Other topics for discussion were EU nationals under Brexit, UK nationals living in the EU, and Refugees and Asylum Seekers.

The **Guild** celebrated 130 years. A Joint Report with the **National Youth Assembly** spoke of good inter-generational work and gave a challenge to the Church, reflecting on the missing generations between Youth and Senior members.

The **Iona Community Board** made a call for support for refurbishment work at Iona Abbey and the Macleod Centre.

The **Ecumenical Relations Committee** began with marking the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, reminding us of the motto: *ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda*, a reformed Church always being reformed.

The **Ministries Council** promised legislation for 'Hub-style' Ministry. The new Ascend support and education programme and website for Ministries was launched. There were pleas for the Church to grapple with the crisis of the shortage of Ministers. The centrality of preaching in the Church was affirmed, as was the need for greater 'resilience' among ministers and congregations. Ministerial deployment and Presbytery Planning are likely to be the most critical issues from this Assembly.

The work of **Forces Chaplains** is greatly valued, but there is a serious shortage of Church of Scotland Chaplains in the services.

The **Mission & Discipleship Council** reported that while the overall picture was one of decline, there were still people discovering faith and growing in faith all over the Church. This tied in with a new Sharing Faith resource. The theory and practice of children taking communion is to be examined afresh. The National Youth Assembly is to have a major review of its work and future.

The report of the **National Youth Assembly** had some discussion of Gender Justice and Mental Health issues.

The **Theological Forum** is to consider what might need to be addressed in any new legislation for ministers to perform same-sex marriages. The Ecumenical Relations Committee is also to invite comment on this from our ecumenical partners in other denominations. The Forum was urged to do more work on reconciliation on this issue in the Church of Scotland and beyond

The Assembly had some high points and encouraging moments. Yet it also illustrated divisions within the Kirk on some issues, not least theology and sexuality. And the Kirk faces huge challenges on buildings, finance and ministries. The Call to Prayer issued at the start of the week was even more necessary by the end of it.

We were well represented this year by the Minister, Keith Stewart, Robert Burgon and Gregor Penman. If you'd like to know more, please ask any of them.

MUSICAL MEMORIES OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2017

Although I had heard from others that the music at the General Assembly was "special", it wasn't until I attended on Saturday 20 May 2017 as a first-time Commissioner that I appreciated exactly how special it was to join with around 800 other voices in singing God's praises.

Every morning started with a service of worship and the daily papers helpfully included the melody of each item of praise (which assisted with the less familiar items). Led by a precentor (with organ accompaniment usually for the final item of praise each day), the Assembly Hall resounded time and time again. Metrical psalms and Scottish paraphrases were in evidence each day although there were also more modern hymns and worship songs. During Communion on the Monday morning (which was attended by the Princess Royal), we sang Psalm 24 verses 7-10, better known as "Ye gates, lift up your heads on high", and I suspect that this has been a feature of Assembly Communion for many years.

After the success of last year's Swing Band Service, we are delighted that the Swing Band have agreed to make a return visit to Abbey Church this summer. Last year, £1,235 was raised for the Church of Scotland HIV programme with the collection at the service. Put the date in your diary now and come along early on the night to be sure of a seat. Bring your friends.

Tuesday evening saw the Assembly Hall packed with members of the Guild and some Commissioners for "The Guild Big Sing" and we sang items which had topped a poll of Guild members (all familiar to us in Abbey).

My only previous experience of the General Assembly was a couple of years when I attended the Friday morning session to hear the report of the Church of Scotland Investors Trust (of which I am a trustee). I bumped into former Abbey elder Brian Porteous that morning (when he was attending his first Assembly) and had noted that he sang with the Assembly Choir (which consisted of volunteer Commissioners and a few staff from 121 George Street). This prompted me to respond to the invitation to join this year's choir, which rehearsed at the lunch breaks on Wednesday and Thursday and then once again before the service started on Friday morning. It was great to see Gregor Penman (who was attending as the Presbytery of Lothian's youth representative) in the choir (and I believe he was probably the youngest singer there). We were conducted by Rev Colin Renwick, Minister of Dunblane Cathedral and we sang a modern setting of "There is a Balm in Gilead" by Lloyd Larson. Feedback suggests that it went down quite well.

In addition to the singing, I met several people involved in music in their churches (including an organist from Shetland and an Aberdeenshire Minister who sometimes plays when his church is without an organist).

I have many happy memories of General Assembly 2017 but my musical memories are amongst the best.
