Some of these tug at our heart-strings with their photos or stories of people (or animals) in need. Others seem almost brutal in their honesty as they tell us about the state of our nation or of the world.

These appeals seem to assume that we will be more generous than usual at this time of year. Or perhaps they exploit a sort of hidden sense of guilt, that when we spend so much on indulging ourselves we feel that we should give at least something to others. It's unfortunate that the methods of some charities have recently been called into question. A few high-profile cases in the news have the effect of smearing the rest. But that shouldn't make us cynical or tight-fisted when it comes to helping others.

I was recently reminded of a saying of Jesus that it's more blessed to give than to receive.

Sometimes we may feel a bit of 'charity burnout'- there are so many needy cases, so many good causes. But another verse in scripture reminds us 'don't get tired of doing good, for in time we'll reap a harvest if we don't give up'.

The Bible makes it clear that any generosity on our part is because of God's generosity in his gift to us of Jesus. As we enjoy that gift, the greatest gift of all, let that spill over into the lives of others, and especially people who are poor or needy. Then God will bless you!
