Dear friends,

By the time you read this, the European Referendum will be well and truly over. It's been described as the most important decision our country will make in a generation.



Sometimes we may feel that we suffer from 'referendum burnout' with the seemingly endless programmes, interviews and panel debates. But these have raised many vital issues about the future of our nation, such as the health service, pensions, tax, public spending, and immigration. All these issues - and others too - make us ask what sort of country we really want to be.

That's a very good question, isn't it? What kind of society, or world, do we hope for? Recent news has headlined mass gun murders in the USA, but there have also been dreadful stories of murder and child abuse here in our own native land, and the continuing tragedy of Syria, refugees, and other horrors.

In Scotland, we've long had a reputation for being a welcoming, tolerant and inclusive society. I believe that our Christian heritage is one of the main reasons for this. But it also makes me wonder which direction we will take as the influence of the Christian faith wanes in the public sphere, at home and in Europe, the home of the Reformation.

Jeremiah ch. 29 is often quoted as a message of hope in difficult days. Perhaps verse 7 is a word for us at this time in our nation: *'seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have taken you. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper'*.

## Christian Aid Week 2016

We are part of the Group of churches in North Berwick (including Dirleton) who come together to raise funds for the Christian Aid annual appeal.

This year the appeal was for Bangladesh to help households overcome the terrible problems they suffer every year with the flooding which occurs at the time of the Monsoons.

This year we welcomed Caroline Vevers from St Andrew Blackadder as the new Chairman of the group, taking over from Barbara Clarke who had served as Chairman for many years.

The programme of Events including, Coffee Mornings, Street Collections and Quizzes continued with great success, due mainly to the contributions that so many Church members gave over the week.

A total of over £11k was raised which, although less than last year, was still very commendable. The Dirleton coffee morning raised over £500 and our contribution to the Smartie Tubes collection (including Dirleton) was nearly £600.

The figures from the National picture are not yet available but it has been clear from previous years that our contributions are well above the national average for our population

Thanks to all who helped and gave of their time and thanks to everyone who filled and returned their collection envelopes.

The money raised will go a long way to helping alleviate the poverty caused by the Flooding in Bangladesh in coming years as well as helping in places like Syria with so much hardship and difficulties caused by the Refugee crisis.
