Harvest Donations

As we have been unable to bring our usual gifts to church this year as part of our Harvest Thanksgiving celebrations, members might want to support the excellent, and much needed work of the East Lothian Foodbank in the coming week. Gifts of products can be placed in the usual collection baskets in Tesco and Nisa. As an alternative, the Foodbank welcomes cash donations which can be made online by visiting the website: <u>Eastlothian.foodbank.org.uk</u> or by post to: East Lothian Foodbank, 3 Civic Square, Tranent, East Lothian, EH33 1LH **Blythswood is going ahead with the Shoe Box Appeal 2020**. In these difficult times many who have provided gifts in the past will find it much more difficult to do so this year. Indeed, for many months it has been impossible to obtain empty shoe boxes. However, we can provide some covered boxes, available from Abbey and Dirleton churches from the beginning of October. A leaflet will be inside each box and extra leaflets will be available in church. Blythswood have announced that if shoe boxes are not available they will accept gifts in a drawstring bag. The last collecting date will be around the end of October. If desired, in lieu of a box, a donation can be made to help with the cost of transporting the gifts abroad. The need, of course, is even greater this year because of the global pandemic. Simple gifts can be invaluable to families in need, and a blessing to those who receive them.

Church Services

To comply with Scottish Government regulations and Church of Scotland guidance, we have to adopt the following procedures:

- All people attending our service must observe a minimum of 2 metres social distancing at all times when in church and on their way in and out of the building. Worshippers will be guided to seats (which have been laid out to maintain social distancing) and should stay in those seats throughout the service. Provision will be made for those from the same household to sit together.
- All worshippers must wear face coverings (unless they have an exemption from doing so) and hand sanitiser will be provided.
- There will be no singing.
- Offerings can be made either on entry or on leaving the church (but will not be uplifted during the service).
- Contact details of all worshippers will be collected and stored for 28 days after the service in accordance with our privacy policy, a copy of which will be on display in church.
- There will be no printed intimations and hymn books and bibles have been removed from the church.
- Toilets will be open, but their use will be restricted to one person at a time.
- Tea and coffee will not be available after the service.

• Please be aware that our services at Abbey Church will be recorded and recordings of that morning's service will be made available later on the website for those who are unable to attend our services including those for whom attendance at this stage is probably not appropriate due to underlying health conditions.

As numbers attending church services have been limited by the Scottish Government and are also dependant on the layout of the church, we will operate a booking system each week.

Bookings can be made by phone or email during church office hours (1000-1300) on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the week prior to the service. To make a booking for that week's service, please either phone during these hours (01620 892800) or email your request to <u>abbeychurch@abbeychurch.co.uk</u> giving details of the names of the people from your household who wish to attend and one contact telephone number and whether you would like to attend Abbey Church or Dirleton Kirk. Please do not leave phone messages and any emails received before Tuesday at 10.00am cannot be accepted. Bookings will only be taken for that week's service and the process for the following Sunday will commence on the Tuesday of that week.

If after booking, you feel unwell on the Sunday, we would respectfully request that you do not attend that service.

Track and Trace during the week. Could we respectfully ask that if you are in the Abbey church building at any time other than Sunday service please register at the side door, whether you are in the building for an hour or a minute. Thank you.

Our Sunday service themes this autumn are based on five short and often overlooked books of the Bible. Sometimes referred to as the 'Five Scrolls' ('*Megilloth*' in Hebrew), the little books of books of Ruth, Esther, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs and Lamentations have struggled to be recognised against the 'giants' such as Isaiah, Genesis or Psalms. They have recently been called 'The Forgotten Books of the Bible'. Yet they have a message as relevant for us today as any other books. Refugees, ethnic cleansing, sexuality, genocide, finding meaning in a confusing world - these are just some of their themes. Two Sunday services will be devoted to each book, with the introductory one today: 'Where can Wisdom be found?'

On Sunday 6th and 13th September, Bob Kane will conduct worship in Abbey, and the online services those days will be from the Moderator, Martin Fair.

<u>Try Praying</u>

As a church we have made the Try Praying booklets available to anyone who would like to take one. Most will have been taken by people who have previously no experience of church. This initiative continues to be very successful. Please continue to pray for all those who might read a booklet or visit the Try Praying website, that these spiritual seeds sown would take root in their life, grow and flourish in their life, and pray that people may experience the joy of answered prayer and come to a relationship with Jesus.
