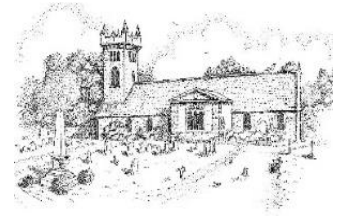

**Readings: Psalm 34:1-8; (Abbey only) Mark 10:46-52**

I will extol the Lord at all times; his praise will always be on my lips. I will glory in the Lord; let the afflicted hear and rejoice.
